Keyboarding Techniques - Rules, Position, Advice. Mastering the A, S, D, F, J, K, L, ; keys is the most important technique. Use a color-coded keyboard to know which keys to press during exercise. Trust yourself and locate the key with your finger to build muscle memory. Each row and key is reserved to be hit by certain fingers. Stick to it!

Place your index fingers on the F and J keys. The other fingers should be placed on the keyboard as shown in the figure. Your fingers should lightly touch the keys. This is the "Basic Position". When not typing or after pressing a key your fingers should always return to the basic position.
